



Jamie Steven has recently retired as head of the Met Police Diplomatic Protection Group during a 4 year period of unprecedented threat against the U.K. A respected and leading authority on security operations having experienced the intensity of enduring high threat alerts and terrorist incidents as he led and managed security, protection and firearms operations at diplomatic, government and law enforcement locations across London.

Much of Jamie's' 30 years service has been working in the operational field. As a detective he managed numerous major crime scenes and investigated serious violent crimes, including murder and sexual offences. As a firearms officer he has taken part in hundreds of protection and proactive operations, including leading a hostage rescue operation as a specialist firearms officer.

He has also led public order units during riots and as first response to 7 separate bomb scenes. As a Borough uniform officer Jamie became experienced in a range of policing areas ending his borough career as Head of Operations at Hackney and also Camden where he managed the release of the paedophile Sidney Cooke. At Camden he was operations manager responsible for operational performance whilst coordinating North London's Op Crackdown (counter drugs) operations.

Jamie's penultimate posting with the Metropolitan Police was with the West London Murder Investigation Command. He started as authorising officer for proactive operations and the largest pool of informants in England & Wales, and was subsequently appointed head of the command overseeing all Senior Investigating Officers leading murder investigations during a period of unprecedented crime levels.
