



Mick Massey is one of the country's most experienced fire fighting experts. He spent over 30 years with the London Fire Brigade, in recent years pioneering the Inter-Agency Liaison Officers role during some of the most high profile incidents such as the 7/7 and 21/7 bombings in London, and the Buncefield Oil Depot Fire disaster.

Mick was one of the first Fire Brigade Inter-Agency Liaison Officers, a group set up by the LFB in conjunction with the Metropolitan Police and other agencies to enhance co-operation between all emergency services, and is extremely knowledgeable in all aspects of disaster management.

During his long career he has experienced many major incidents including the IRA bombings in the late 70's and 80's, the Iranian Embassy siege, the Clapham, Southall and Paddington rail crashes, the Hackney siege and many more.

As the press liaison officer for the Brigade he is also a veteran of many news broadcasts and has a relaxed unflappable style. He has undertaken everything from interviews at the scenes of major incidents, to the use of a Fire Brigade thermal image camera to determine if an Anteater at London zoo was pregnant! He was also called upon to help with technical advice and story-line assistance for 'London's Burning' a popular drama set in a London fire station in the 1990's(?).

In addition to his extensive operational background, Mick is skilled in presenting to large and small groups including major conferences, and is an experienced trainer. Despite only retiring a few weeks ago - he is already in demand to undertake consultancy work in the private sector.
